AT OSGOODE HALL An Action in Which Applies Were the Cause of Discouragement of Company Liability. In the appeal in Woolley v. Corless, before the Divisional Court, the trouble is again about apples, but in this case the defendant, unlike her first parent, will not allow the plaintiff to pick or cut the fruit of her farm.

The learned judge of the County of Elgin held that the plaintiff was not entitled to succeed, because he had failed to comply with certain terms of the will, the performance of which was a condition precedent to his obtaining the desired fruit.

The Divisional Court, without passing any opinion upon the terms imposed upon the first parent, having regard to the condition precedent to his obtaining the desired fruit, dismissed the plaintiff's appeal with costs.

Action for Personal Injuries. The Junior Division of the Court of Appeal, consisting of the Chief Justice, Mr. Justice Macdougall, Mr. Justice G. R. H. Co. The defendants appeal against the \$1500 damages. The plaintiff, who is a professional singer, was injured by a truck belonging to the defendant, the Canadian Express Co., while changing from one train to another at the Union Station in Toronto.

The court dismissed the appeal with costs against the express company, who, they held, is to blame, the plaintiff having been run down from behind by one of their trucks carrying beer barrels, and driven by a man in front with his head down, who could not see where he was going, and who was not allowed through the ranks of beer. The railway are not to blame and their appeal is allowed with costs. Both the defendants appeared by the same solicitor, so that costs are to be set off.
