the support of their ministers in this Island. And after some further observations, in which he pointed out the duty of sustaining their own Church, he called on the Secretary to read the Annual Report.

The Report having been read, and the Treasurer's account submitted to the meeting, it was moved by the Rev. W. Meek, seconded by Charles Palmer, Esq.,

Resolved, That the Report now read be adopted, and printed, under the direction of the Committee.

Moved by the Rev. D. Parnther, and seconded by H. Haszard, Esq.,

Resolved. That this meeting desires to return thanks to Almighty God for the many blessings, both temporal and spiritual, which he has vouchsafed to this Island during the past year.

Moved by the Rev. H. Read, and seconded by Capt. Orlebar, R. N.,

Resolved, That this meeting gratefully records its sense of thankfulness to the Society for the Propagation of the Gospel in Foreign Parts, the Society for Promoting Christian Knowledge, and also to the Colonial, Church, and School Societies, for their liberal and ready help towards the members of the Church of England in this Colony, whereby they are enabled to worship God after the manner of their fathers.

Moved by the Rev. D. FitzGerald, and seconded by the Hon. the Attorney General,

Resolved, That this meeting thankfully acknowledges the valuable assistance and co-operation of the Ladies' Branch of this Society.

Moved by Theos. DesBrisay, Esq., and seconded by T. B. Tremain, Esq.,

Resolved, That whereas it is a matter of convenience to the country clergymen, and appears to be conducive to the general interest of the Society, to alter the time of holding its Annual Meeting: it is therefore resolved, that the Annual Meeting of this Society shall in future be held on the 3rd Tuesday in January, at the hour of 7 o'clock, P M., and that the fourth Quarterly Meeting of the Committe be held on the same day, at 12 o'clock, A. M.
