The entire Chinese crew climbed aboard the French steamer and left Captain Thomas, who was injured, one officer and the engineers to navigate the Falshan to Shelter Bay, where she was blown ashore. The Bishop of Victoria, Dr. J. C. Hoare, was on his way to visit some neighboring islands when the storm broke, and is reported missing. His launch has been found floating bottom upwards. Many valuable steel lighters have been foot. Some of them were hurled ashore. Channels will have to be dug to permit some of the vessels ashore to be refloated. The force of the wind and waves was such that some vessels were landed almost high and dry.
