BOYS, MEN AND PUBLIC SCHOOLS

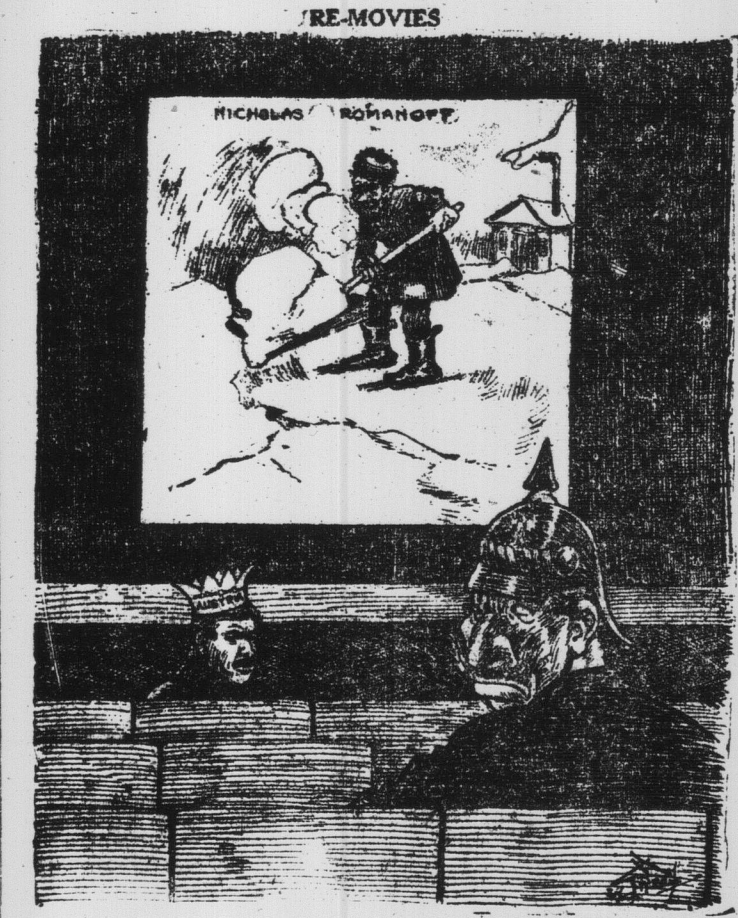
Dr. John Noble of Toronto Board Has Progressive Ideas on Public School Education

Dr. John Noble has progressive ideas on the subject of public school education. He would make revolutionary changes in the Toronto schools if he could induce his fellow-members of the board to depart from standard and custom. To begin with, if he had his way, he would carry the idea of the kindergarten all through the school course—all instruction would be accompanied by making and doing. "Our present system," he says, "fosters a dislike for work and anything approaching manual labor. We deliberately make the children lazy. A child's natural instinct is to do things, moving around, to be busy. All children are active. We squish and hush all this out of them; put them in seats screwed down to the floor and dare them to move." He would change all this. He would carry the system of the kindergarten forward, enlarging it, right up to where it merged into the technical school.

Dr. Noble is on right lines, we believe, and it would not surprise The Star if in twenty years the public schools of Toronto have been considerably remodelled in the way he suggests.

It is astonishing with what ease the average child can learn to do anything that requires the use of both hand and brain. Yet our school method is to tie the child hand and foot, impose silence and inaction, and make instruction entirely mental. The whole system is set up by or for the teacher, instead of for the taught.

Observe how useless the average man is because of the way his natural talents were suppressed in youth. Take the office man who has reached the age of fifty. If his electric doorknob is out of order he is baffled by the mystery of it. All he can do is to push the button and wonder why it doesn't ring. So he telephones somebody to come and fix it, and it costs him a dollar, and a month later another one. If he knew anything about his own doorknob he could have fixed it at the trolley, the telephone, the electric light, the flying machine, the skyscraper, the orange fresh from the trees in California, the grape-fruit from the South Seas, he reads a cablegram before noon in Toronto telling what happened at noon in London or Paris, and fails to comprehend the significance of what he sees and the marvels of daily life. But he would know if he were permitted. He is all ages to find out. The schools, however, forbid it. He is forced to hunch himself into a seat screwed to the floor, and glue his eyes on the pages of a book.



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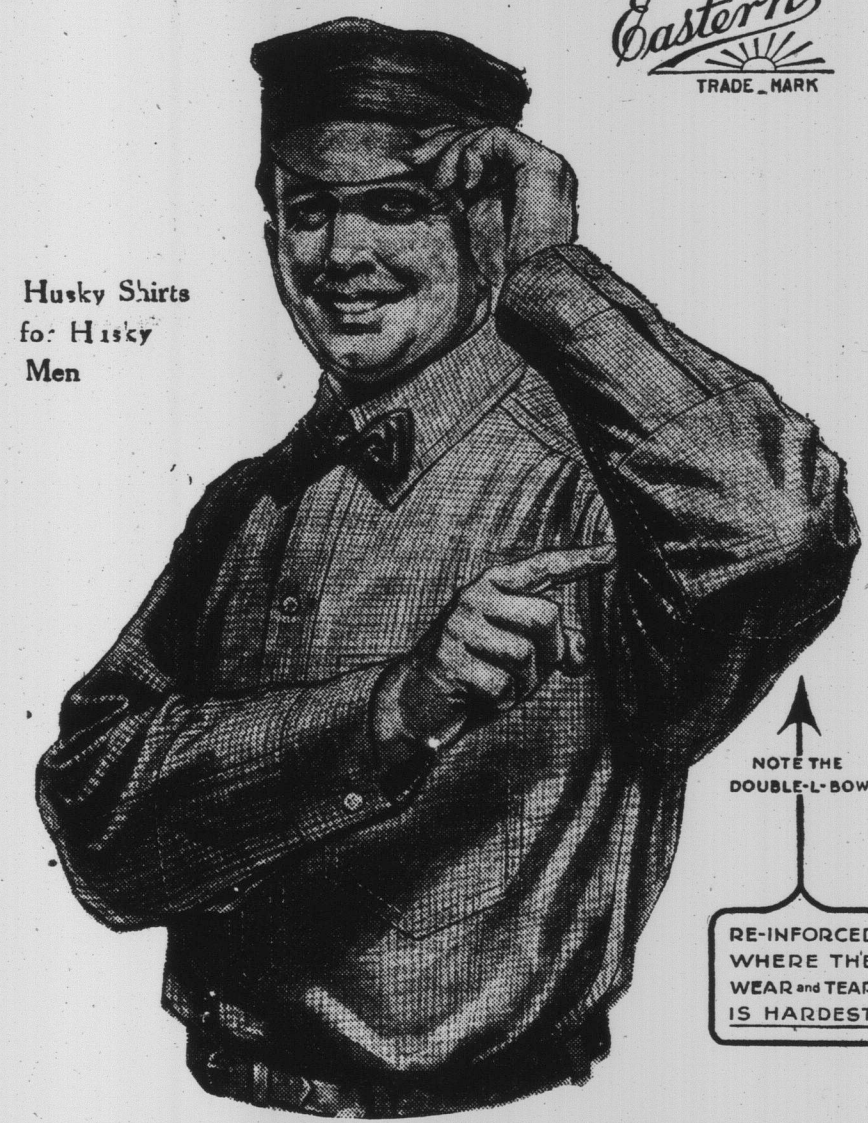
