### GOULD'S MAJORITY OF 49,000 IN MAINE HELD KLAN REBUFF

**Democratic Wards in Cities Turn Heavily in Favor of Republican**

BANGOR, Me., Nov. 30.—Latest returns show a majority of about 49,000 votes for Arthur R. Gould, of Presque Isle, Republican, over Fulton J. Redman, of Ellsworth, Democrat, in the special election for U. S. Senator yesterday.

Analysis of this overwhelmingly large majority exceeding the forecasts of the most optimistic Republican leaders shows one of the most remarkable elections in Maine's political history. It is apparent that an anti-K. K. K. sentiment was shown all over Maine by a heavy swing of Democratic votes to Gould, especially in the cities where wards always topheavily Democratic.

The announcement by Governor Brewster that he could not support Mr. Gould under the existing conditions is believed to have reacted in favor of Mr. Gould rather than otherwise.

Asrook county, home of Mr. Gould, appeared to be the one battle spot in Maine giving its favorite son nearly 8,000 majority or a vote of about nine to one against his opponent and more than 3,000 more votes than in the primary election, showing almost a sweeping wave of party lines.

Agatha figured as a particular hot spot for Gould, the entire electorate casting its vote for Mr. Gould, polling 938 votes, when in the last gubernatorial election the town gave a Democratic majority of 204. On the contrary, Mr. Redman failed to carry his own ward or his own city of Ellsworth. He issued a statement last night to the effect that he would carry the fight to the end.
