### DISASTER AT UNION DEPOT

Heavy Roof Structure Collapses and Tons of Metal Fall.

The roof structure of the train shed at the Union passenger station collapsed last evening at 6:08 o'clock, a little before time of departure of the Maritime express, Fredericton and suburban trains. Fortunately no one was killed as the passengers were on board the trains and the station at the time was almost empty. William Shea, a baggage-master on the Fredericton train, sustained a fractured leg when he was struck by a piece of plank and Dow Gay, brakeman on the Maritime express, had a narrow escape. A woman who was on the platform at the time was walking along and in order to save her he jumped and pushed her into the shed ahead of him.

The roofs of four cars of the Maritime train were damaged. Several expressmen were working in the shed at the time but as they were near the express rooms they could dodge in and none was injured. Several trucks were smashed and a few express packages destroyed. A crate containing a bulldog was broken and the little animal escaped. On account of the collapse of the roof the trains last night and this morning arrived and left from the outside tracks. A gang of men was put on the work and this morning the twisted iron girders were removed so that during the day traffic in the station was resumed. Mrs. W. E. Raymond and Mrs. W. B. Tennant of the hospitality committee of the National Council of Women had narrow escapes. Mrs. Raymond assisted baggage-master Shea until he was taken to the hospital. Pictures were taken of the ruins by the Fox News and Canadian Pictorial.

L. R. Ross, terminal agent, said that the roof had been condemned and the railway were proceeding to remove it so that it was an accident and he could not see how any one could be blamed for the unfortunate occurrence. Commissioner Thornton and a large force of policemen were on the scene immediately to look after casualties and the fire department was called. Tons of metal fell.





### EQUAL RIGHTS TO WOMEN OF WORLD

Suffrage Alliance Will Continue Efforts — Mrs. Daniels Speaks on Labor Legislation.

The International Woman Suffrage Alliance Congress at Geneva has decided that the alliance should be continued to secure suffrage and equal rights with men for the women of all nations. This decision was put in the form of an amendment to Article 11 of the constitution. The amendment says: "Resolved, that the object of the alliance shall be in the future to secure enfranchisement of the women of all nations by the promotion of woman suffrage and also such other reforms as are necessary to establish real equality of liberties, status and opportunities between men and women."

Laws guaranteeing a living wage for all toilers, equal pay for equal work, abolition of sweatshops, and child labor legislation were outlined by Mrs. Joseph Daniels, delegate from the United States, as measures appealing to the women of the world. She conveyed to the delegates the felicitations of President Wilson and "his confident belief that enfranchisement of woman will bring fresh and spiritual ideas to aid in the solution of pressing world problems."

"What women did in war hastened the conferring of the ballot," declared Mrs. Daniels. "In our country the day of agitation for enfranchisement has passed. The hour has come when we must prove by deeds that we accept our new duties with a sense of our obligation to measure up to our new and high mission."

As we go into the political trenches let us endeavor to be as intrepid, aim as straight and keep our nerve as steady as our brothers in their grim battles. As voters we must make or find a way to carry help and comfort to those who live in want or in peril."

Problems yet to be solved, Mrs. Daniels said, included abolition of the double standard of the sexes, aid for mothers, education of all children, old age pensions and the guarantees of sanitation and of free hospitals.
