Prosecutor Finds Two Convicted Croatians Were Not Implicated in Holdup.

Two men innocent of the crime for which they were convicted have been for 14 months in Sing Sing, it was announced Thursday by Owen Bohan, assistant district attorney, who prosecuted the case before Judge Mulqueen in General Sessions in June of last year. The men are Frank Pezzulich and Frank Sgelirrach, Croatians, and are serving terms of from eight to sixteen years after having been convicted of participating in the hold-up of the convicted of participating in the hold-up of the dead of reasonable doubt was filed in the Supreme Court by K. 




