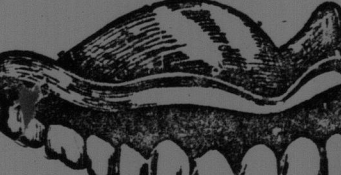

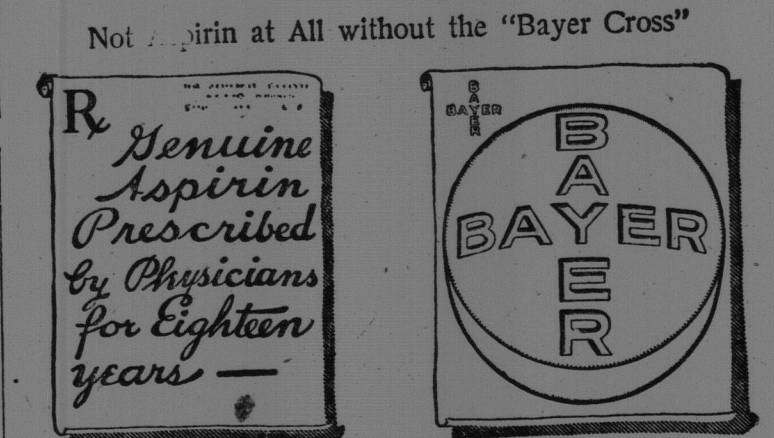
## 62ND WINTER TRAINING

## FIRST CONCERT BY CREW OF A WINTER STEAMER

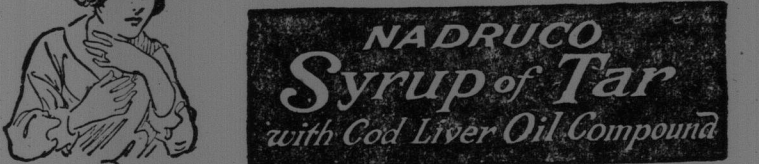
