## QUIT IN HALIFAX BOUT; NEAR RIOT; BOXING GETS A SET-BACK

Halifax, April 25.—The quitting of Harry Skelcher, advertised as one of England's best light-heavyweights, in a scheduled fifteen-round boxing bout tonight with Roddie McDonald of Glace Bay, nearly caused a riot in the vicinity of the theatre after it was over, and a squad of policemen was called out to keep order. McDonald, middleweight champion of the maritime provinces, was handing out a severe beating to the Englishman who quit cold in the middle of the first round and refused to continue.
