very beginning of the war, as one writer

gium, the harness dogs which up to that  
time had been used for hauling milk,  
vegetables, and other products, began to  
assist the refugees in getting their chil-  
dren and household goods out of the in-  
vaded country. Later they hauled light  
artillery, and carts laden with blankets,  
bread, hay, and scores of other things  
for the comfort of the soldiers and their  
horses. Dogs did sentry duty in the  
trenches, patrolled No-Man's-Land, car-  
ried dispatches through barbed wire en-  
tanglements, amid a hail of bullets, and  
above all, added to the laurels of their  
ancestors through the ages by seeking  
out and helping the wounded very where  
on the far-flung battlefields of Europe  
and beyond.

suite" in the old Revere House, Boston,  
Massachusetts, hangs a decorated shield

1870; Grand Duke Alexis, 1871; King

of Wales, coming to Boston, would hard-
