WARRANT OF \$20,000 FOR VISIT OF PRINCE OF WALES TO CANADA

Ottawa, Sept. 20—Governor-general's warrants covering unforeseen expenditures aggregating \$795,000, were issued during the parliamentary recess, according to a return tabled in parliament yesterday by Hon. A. K. MacLean. Of this amount \$375,000 covered the cost of moving stock from and to dry areas in western Canada, \$400,000 was required in connection with the reconstruction of the government elevator at Port Colborne, while \$20,000 was required to cover the cost of the visit of the Prince of Wales to Canada.

SUNKEN STEAMER IS LIKELY THE VALBANERA

U. S. Naval Officer Says He Saw Name Plate—Missing Ship Had 450 People Aboard

Key West, Fla., Sept. 20—That the Spanish steamer Valbanera, carrying 300 passengers and a crew of 150, went down in the hurricane that swept Key West ten days ago appeared to have been made certain last night by a statement of Ensign L. B. Roberts, commanding officer of the United States submarine chaser 203, who said he plainly saw the name plate of that steamer on a vessel found yesterday sunk in forty feet of water near here.

The statement of Ensign Roberts corroborated that of divers who, on order of the Cuban consul here, made an investigation of the sunken vessel. The wreck was seen by the sub chaser and the coast guard vessel Tuscarora near Rebecca Shoals Lighthouse, about forty miles from Key West. It lay in water which covers a bed of quicksand. No bodies were seen.

The Valbanera has been missing since the storm which caught her as she neared Havana en route from Spanish ports to New Orleans. The passengers are thought to have been almost entirely Spaniards or Cubans, as virtually all of them were to have been debarked at Havana.

Not So Many
Madrid, Sept. 20—Despatches from Havana confirm the loss of the Spanish steamship Valbanera. Among the first class passengers was Anastasio Somo, a Havana merchant, who was accompanied by his three children. There were five second class passengers and sixty-four third class.

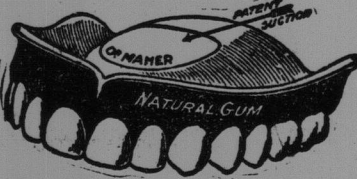
In Navy 56 Years.
