CORRESPONDENT SAID HE WAS GOING OVER

Floyd Gibbons, Reported Wounded, May Have Carried Out His Promise—Was on the Lancia
Chicago, June 13.—Floyd Gibbons, who has been wounded while serving the Chicago Tribune at the front in France, first came into national notice by his work in Mexico. As correspondent of the Tribune he was with Villa in the Mexican campaign which laid Mexico at Villa's feet and paved the way for his triumphant entry into the capital. He was with Villa again on his last campaign, when the former bandit met his Waterloo at Celaya. He is a veteran of Pershing's expedition into Mexico. For more than a year he has been with the American forces at the front in France.
Gibbons was born in Washington and was educated at Georgetown University. He began his newspaper career in Minneapolis. He came to Chicago six years ago, and for the greater part of the time since has been a member of the Tribune staff.
A few months after his return from the Rio Grande he was sent by the Tribune to Europe as war correspondent. He had a chance to go on a ship which bore Ambassador von Bernstorff and was immune from submarine attack. He chose to gamble for a big story and sailed on the Lancia. The ship was torpedoed off the Irish coast, and the description which Gibbons wrote won him international distinction.
When Ring Lardner was in Europe a few months ago, Gibbons told him of a
