THE WAR NEWS.

The great battle of the Aisne is still in progress. The fact that it has continued so long without a decisive result is explained by the official bureau, which says that since the Germans occupy strong defensive positions the battle takes on the character of war by assault along a fortified front.

With regard to German operations in France, the correspondent of the London Daily Telegraph says that none of the military authorities with whom he has conversed believe that the Germans will be able to take the offensive again on a large scale.

Mr. Winston Churchill, speaking in Liverpool last night, expressed great gratification over the results thus far achieved in the war. He said: "I could not have hoped that circumstances at this stage of the war would have been so favorable for the allies."

LORD KITCHENER.

In his book "With Kitchener in Khartoum," published in 1899, the late Mr. George W. Steevens, the famous war correspondent, wrote as follows: "There are some who nurse a desperate hope that he (Kitchener) may some day be appointed manager of the war office."

The prophecy has been fulfilled. In his description of Kitchener at that time Steevens also wrote: "He stands several inches over six feet; straight as a lance and looks out imperiously above most men's heads. His motions are deliberate and strong. Slender, but firmly knit, he seems built for tireless steel-wire endurance rather than for power and agility."
