New York, Dec. 12.—The speeder, greater menace to life and limb in the United States last year than smallpox, tuberculosis and several other diseases combined, is being forced to go into "reverse."

When he can't be induced to put on the brake voluntarily, the law is throwing on the emergency for him. The first American judge definitely to repudiate the fine system, and try to show the speeder the criminal nature of his offense in more forcible

Then Traffic Judge Sawicki of Cleveland went the judge one better by sentencing speeders to attend, under police guard, the funeral of a 7-year-old girl killed by a motor car.

Now Judge Joseph F. Chambers of Los Angeles has also tried the "B.I. please, and don't do it again" form of punishment, and is seeking a more effective way of making offenders run in "low."

ALL PAY FOR THE  
ESCAPE OF ONE

Sing Sing Cells Close on 1,200 Convicts for a Day to Teach a Community Lesson.

New York, Dec. 12.—Because Patrick Dealey, a Sing Sing amateur actor and long-term prisoner, escaped early on Saturday morning, prison officials took recreation privileges away from the 1,200 inmates of the Ossining institution for a day. They were locked in their cells for twenty-four hours, it was announced, when the period of unusual confinement ended.

The cell doors closed early on Saturday afternoon. The customary picture show for the convicts on Saturday night was omitted and not a man emerged until Sunday afternoon except to go to meals and to church services. "Was that done to punish them?" was asked of Warden Ewens.

"No," he replied, and Charles F. Hagan, State Superintendent of Prisons, added, "It was for discipline." The warden added the inmates to the "No." "We wish the inmates to understand that recreation is a privilege, not a right. We wish to impress upon them that the system here is based upon community-interest and that there must be group-responsibility."  
Superintendent Rattigan predicted that if there is another show for outside public such as the musical comedy at the close of which Dealey escaped, the warden would be sending Dealey to the Warden's office. He did not explain what new precautions had been devised.  
Search for Dealey was pressed without success. Visiting records were investigated to find out who had called on Dealey in prison. His brother, Hugh Dealey, was one visitor and Miss Helen McAndrews of 2241 Eighth avenue, Manhattan, was the other. Miss McAndrews, according to prison attendants, attended the prison show on two nights. Prison officials and guards declare that, so far as they had observed, she did not get near Dealey. Officials corrected two mistakes that have been made. At regular visits keepers hear the conversations between inmates and callers, who do not come into actual contact.  
"We doubt very much if a woman helped Dealey to get away," said Warden Ewens. The warden said he was inclined to the opinion that two young men, friends of Dealey, helped him to get away. The two young men have not been eliminated as possible helpers. Dealey is reported to have been seen in a uniform and to get away once he had walked out the front door with departing patrons.  
Circulars with pictures and a pedigree of Dealey, offering the customary reward, were sent broadcast. Officials are hopeful of Dealey's recapture because the left side of his face was conspicuously due to an injury.

TO ABANDON SHIP  
GROUNDED ON THE  
CALIFORNIA COAST

San Francisco, Dec. 12.—The British freighter Oteric, which crashed on Fish Rock on the California coast, seventy miles north of here, in a dense fog last night, is to be abandoned, as the damage is too serious to attempt a tow, according to wireless message received from the Oteric at 10:30 a. m., by the federal wireless station here. Transfer of the Asiatic members of the steamer's crew to the steamer Cotton Plant was completed at 9:30 a. m. but the white crew were standing by the ship, according to a radio message received here. The El Segundo, which had been standing by the Oteric, departed for San Francisco at 9:30 a. m.

SOME DANCE STEPS  
BARRED BY POLICE  
Mrs. Loft, New York Deputy  
Commissioner, Persuades  
Proprietors to Agree to  
Reform.  
New York, Dec. 12.—Dance hall proprietors of New York City are forming an organization for the elimination of the "chicago," "ballooning," "stir" dancing and "parking" from the public dance halls of New York city. The agreement of the principle dance hall proprietors to form an organization to bar objectionable steps was brought about by Mrs. George W. Loft, Deputy Police Commissioner, who called them together at a meeting at the West Thirty-seventh street police station.  
Mrs. Loft told those assembled that slow and light dancing was permitted in the public halls, that complaints from mothers were annoying the Police Department and that Commissioner Bright was prepared to take drastic measures by way of arrests and cancellations of licenses to put a stop to it. She said that Commissioner Loft had suggested as a possible alternative the voluntary purification of public dancing by the dance hall proprietors.  
Proprietors Agree to Ban.  
All the dance hall proprietors agreed that objectionable dancing was desirable. "The worst dancing is at the best hotels," one of the dance hall proprietors said at the meeting of proprietors after Mrs. Loft had outlined her views. She is said to have agreed with this, but to have conceded that such dancing was not so pernicious because it affected comparatively few, while thousands were trained in various styles of dancing at the public halls. It was said to be impracticable, from the police standpoint, to regulate closely what took place at private affairs.  
One of the dance hall proprietors said that no form of dancing was so bad as the failure to dance, which is now said to be becoming popular on many floors in New York City. This was said to be a technical description of dancing as "ballooning" by the man who denounced it.  
"Variations of 'Parking,'" "Parking," he said, "is when a couple takes the floor to dance and then stop dancing. They simply say on the floor 'parking' and sit through the dance. There are any number of variations to this."  
The "Chicago" was described as a slow step belonging to cabarets rather than to the dance. "Ballooning" was described concisely as "rough."  
In general the plan of reform, it was said yesterday, is to introduce a noticeable distance and a broader motion in public dancing. Several of the large dancing places, it was pointed out, have sets of floor managers, sometimes called umpires or referees, who compel observance of the rules of the hall as to the types of dancing. It is charged, however, that the evasions of the rules are more insidious than the violations.  
Mrs. Loft told the dance hall proprietors that if voluntary action failed
