Q. Did you see anyone living in it?

A. Yes, Peter George.

Q. Well, did your father ever live for any length of time live at all in this house?

A. Which house?

Q. That house that you have just spoken of, on Lot 158?

A. Oh. I don't think so.

Q. Was he ever inside the house?

A. Wh, yes, he was inside of it lots of times.

Q. Would you bring, you and your father down there to St. Peters to see this man and to see the house?

A. We wintered there every winter for five or six years with out cattle.

Q. You and your father would be living on the west side of the river? A. Yes, and this man was always working with him.

Q. When you would be living on the west side of the river he was living in this house on the east side?

A. He would work with my father and go home at night.

Q. He lived with his family in this house on Lot 158?

A. Yes.

Q. Do you maan this man Peter George? A. Yes.

Q. How many winters do you remember, definitely, when this happened, that you have been telling us about?

A. That we lived there?

Q. You and your father wintering the animals on the west side and Peter George living with his family on the east side of lot 158?

A. It might have been five or six, I would not be certain but I would think it was five or six.

Q. And you and your father lived on the west side the whole of the winter. A. Yes.

Q. The whole of each of these winters?

A. Yes, sir.

Q. And he lived in this house on the east side the whole of each of these winters? A. Yes.
