MAKING STUDY OF WHALE LIFE

He Will Make Comparisons Between Pacific and Atlantic Mammals.

R. C. Andrews, of New York, representing the American Museum and Natural History Society, is in the city, having just returned from the West Coast of Vancouver Island. Mr. Andrews went to the West Coast in May, and since that time has been at the whaling stations studying whale life. He has made many trips out to the feeding grounds, and he watched the whole of the operations of taking the mammals. Equipped with splendid cameras, he has obtained an interesting collection of pictures, showing the whales in all phases. He secured photos of the feeding, sporting, and being taken by the harpoon. He has a photo-in-fact, showing the harpoon just about to enter the body of the whale.

Incidentally Mr. Andrews says that the painting made by C. R. Patterson, formerly of the times staff, showing the whale diving just after the harpoon has taken effect, is extremely true to life. It is not exaggerated detail, but is absolutely true to the actual scene.

SUDDEN DEATH OF ARTHUR S. FARWELL

Nelson, B. C., July 30.—At 1:30 yesterday afternoon Arthur Stanhope Farwell, the well known Dominion and provincial land surveyor, was found dead in his bed at his residence by his friend, Mr. Selous. The deceased was in fairly good health and spent the previous evening chatting with his friends at the club, leaving that institution about midnight for his home. He undressed and went to bed and apparently read for some time, then turned out the light, went to sleep, and as near as the doctor can say, died about 7 o'clock yesterday morning.

When Mr. Selous went to inquire why his friend was not up and about, he found him resting quietly in bed. Closer inspection disclosed the fact that he had been dead about five hours. The deceased was greatly respected in this city, where he had resided during the summer months for the past 12 or 14 years. He three times was candidate for the provincial legislature, but was not successful. HOLD-UP MAN GOES TO TRIAL

HE WAS COMMITTED BY MAGISTRATE JAY

Evidence Against White Very Strong—Admissions to Supt. Hussey.

(From Wednesday's Daily.)

Standing in the prisoner's dock and nervously wiping his face from time to time with a dirty handkerchief, the man, who, giving his name as Charles White, has admitted to the police that he is guilty of three holdups in the neighborhood of Victoria, heard the charges against him read by the police court clerk yesterday afternoon. He was not asked to plead. Previously he had told Superintendent Hussey, of the provincial police, that he was in poor health, and, though somewhat recuperated by a good night's rest, he looked far from well as he sat in the dock and listened to the evidence of Messrs. Reid, Barraclough, and Pearce, his thick mop of tangled hair, unshaven face and unkempt clothes accentuating his dejected appearance. The prisoner cried and wept when brought into the court-room, and appeared to feel his position keenly.

He was not represented by counsel. Harold Robertson appeared for the crown.

After the three charges had been read, two of robbery and one of attempted robbery, John S. Reid was called to the witness box. The witness repeated his account of the holdup near the corner of the West Spanish road last Sunday morning.

Reid said he was a resident in the Lake district, Saanich. He had driven into the city about half-past ten on Sunday morning in a gig and had got to within some 200 yards of the old Stevens hotel, on the Saanich road, when a man jumped out from the bushes skirting the roadway and leveling a pistol at him demanded his money.

"I have no money," witness had gasped out.

"Then, what did the man do?" asked Mr. Robertson.

Reid went on to say that the man came toward him and pressed the revolver within 18 inches of his face, so that he could make out three pellets in the chambers, and called upon him to turn out his pockets.

Mr. Robertson—"And you obeyed this order?"

"Yes," was the reply. "I put my gloved hand into my pocket and turned out my money, something like \$2.00—all in silver." The man grabbed the money, said Reid, keeping his gun trained on him.

"Did he let you go then?" asked Mr. Robertson.

"No," replied Reid. "He ordered me to hand over my watch and chain. Witness had refused to do so, but had leaped out of the gig on the opposite side to the hold-up man.

At this juncture, just as things were getting dark, a man in a dark suit, wearing a hat, and carrying a bag, came along the road in a buggy and the hold-up man took a hasty exit through the bushes.

White as the man who held him up. He was not sure that the revolver now in the hands of the police was the one used or not.

"I don't think the man is telling the truth," exclaimed White, when asked if he wished to question Reid. The prisoner, however, said he didn't wish to question the witness.

Mr. Barraclough had seen the man backing into the bushes, but she was unable to identify the prisoner as the man in question.

Joseph Evans, the Elk Lake man, told how he had captured White by juring him into another man's house on the pretense of wishing to provide him a meal.

Superintendent Hussey, called by Mr. Robertson, said that White, as the man then styled himself, had admitted to him that he had held up a man in a cart on the West Spanish road last Sunday morning and had taken two or three dollars from him.

"He said he was masked and had a white handkerchief, and admitted the pistol produced was the one used," said Mr. Hussey. "He further stated that he had arrived in Victoria last Saturday and had taken dinner at a small French restaurant and had passed the night at a lodging house on Humboldt street. He said he was in Seattle on Thursday and Friday last.

"He was asked to point out the house on Humboldt street where he had slept Saturday night, but he refused to do so, and finally acknowledged that he had had a lie and that he had come to Victoria last Wednesday. He told me he came from Idaho.

"The prisoner cried several times while making these confessions," continued Mr. Hussey, "and seemed to feel his position keenly."

George Barraclough, questioned by Crown Attorney Robertson, said that he was five or six hundred yards from the E. & N. tracks when a man sprang out from the bushes skirting the road, and demanded his money.

FATAL TERMINATION TO FIT OF COUGHING

Port Essington, July 28.—A very sudden death occurred at the Queen's hotel about 5 o'clock this evening. She was grasping for breath and could hardly speak.

"Get a doctor," she said. "I am dying."

Some one ran out on the street to call Doctor Wilson, whose office is only a few doors away. Doctor Bela Wilson arrived within five minutes from the time the first alarm was given, but death had come even quicker. She could discover no sign of life in her patient. Dr. W. T. Kergin arrived three minutes later, followed by Dr. T. A. Wilson. All the medical skill of the town was of no avail. For half an hour they tried by artificial respiration and every means possible to restore life, but without success.

There was no hemorrhage apparent, neither did an examination of her mouth and throat show any abnormal condition. Nor was any indication of the cause of her death given by an examination of her personal effects. She had been at the Methodist hospital only a few minutes before, visiting a friend.

Dr. Treiman has been summoned by wire from Prince Rupert, and on his arrival an inquest will be held.

AUTO CAR WENT OVER DALLAS EMBANKMENT

Fortunately None of the Occupants Were Very Seriously Injured.

(From Wednesday's Daily.)

H. F. Bullen, Dr. C. J. Fagan, secretary of the provincial board of health, and also secretary of the British Columbia Anti-Tuberculosis Society, and John W. Bullen, formerly German consul at Vancouver, and now interested in Queen Charlotte mines, had a narrow escape from death at an early hour this morning as a result of an automobile in which they were travelling going over the Dallas road embankment, just opposite St. Lawrence street. All were on their way home from a party at Percy Cridde's.

The party were travelling along the Dallas road about 3 o'clock in Mr. Bullen's car. Mr. Bullen driving. The lights on the machine had gone out and the electric lights were also out. Mr. Bullen could not follow the road. At the corner of St. Lawrence street and Dallas road the latter turns sharply to the north. At this point an electric light had been placed to warn travellers of the danger, but this morning it was out, and Mr. Bullen not noticing he had reached the turn drove straight over the bank, the auto turning a complete somersault onto the driftwood beneath. Of the three men in the car none received serious injuries, although all were more or less shaken up and bruised. Mr. Bullen was struck in the stomach by the driving wheel of the automobile and also had his hip bruised, while Mr. Wolfson was also considerably shaken up. All will be around again as well as ever in the course of a few days. After the accident the injured men were taken to the Dallas hotel, where they still are.

Herbert W. Ashton, provincial constable, lives just across the road from where the accident occurred, and was awakened by shouting. He hurriedly dressed and ran in the direction whence it came. He found the car lying on the beach with Mr. Bullen and Dr. Fagan lying beneath it and Mr. Wolfson lying beside it. He immediately aroused Hamilton Smith, who lives close by, who immediately telephoned to the police station for assistance. In the meantime two passers-by were attracted to the scene by the noise, with their help Messrs. Ashton and Smith lifted the car off Mr. Bullen and Dr. Fagan. By the time the patrol wagon arrived on the scene a crowd of about 20 had gathered. Mr. Wolfson was carried up the bank by some of the crowd, while Mr. Bullen was taken up to the roadway on the back of Constable McLennan. After Dr. Fagan had also been carried up he and Mr. Bullen were taken to the Dallas hotel in the patrol wagon, where their injuries were attended to by Dr. Herman Fagan, while Mr. Wolfson proceeded to his home in Esquimalt.

The car, a large touring one, suffered considerable damage, but can be repaired.
