MOTHER ASSAULTED

BY HER INSANE SON

Antigonish, N. S., May 3.—A very sad and shocking tragedy occurred in the North Grant, a few miles from Antigonish, a few nights ago, when a young man by the name of Alex. Chisholm, while temporarily insane, brutally attacked his mother, a woman sixty-five years of age, causing injuries from which she cannot recover. This son had only come home on a visit from Stellarton a day before, where he was employed as a brakeman on the Intercolonial Railway, and his condition was not at all alarming to the family until an early hour the next morning. Noticing a change for the worse in the man, an elder brother went to neighbors for advice and assistance, and while he was away the mother is supposed to have attempted to soothe and pacify the insane son, when, in a sudden fit, he lunged her and himself down stairs. Her arm was found to be broken in several places, and her face and body so horribly mutilated and bitten that she has been unconscious for two days and will die.

Chatham, N. B., May 3.—Miramichi Steam Navigation Company directors at a meeting this morning decided to discontinue the ferry service at Chatham. This action was taken because of the fact that the service is not paying, and when the local government refused to grant any increased subsidy and the Town Council ordered the company not to increase its rates, the only thing to do was to throw up the service. The ferry will not be run after tonight by the company. It is now up to the Council to arrange for some service quickly. The ferry is the connecting link between Chatham and down river points, and its discontinuance will be a great loss to the town and business.

C. P. R. Suburban Service.

Commencing May 18th and daily to and including June 3rd, suburban train will leave Welsford at 6.45 a. m. arriving in city at 7.55 a. m. HOW A TRAIN RAN INTO ITSELF.

The Hampton and St. Martins daily express, south bound, ran into itself on Monday. There were only three passengers on the train at the time, but two of them received painful injuries. The accident occurred in a peculiar manner. One of the rails had buckled and as the train passed over the hump each car was uncoupled. The engineer did not notice the loss of his train, but was notified by the jerks given to the signal cord as the cars separated. Three jerks is the signal to reverse, and without looking behind him for the cause, the engineer did so as promptly as possible, and hurrying backwards crashed into the train. The passengers were thrown from their seats and J. W. Godard, of St. John, had his back somewhat injured. Another passenger, a commercial traveller, was thrown against a trunk and had his shoulder dislocated. The third passenger and the train crew escaped uninjured. No serious damage was done to the train, which was able to proceed to St. Martins, where medical attendance was summoned for the injured men.
