VESSELS IN PORT.

SAILED FOR WEST BAY. Donaldson Line S. S. Indrani, Capi Telfer, which brought a general argo to St. John, sailed yesterday for West Bay to olad deals for U. K.

The Allan liner Numidian, Capt. McKillop, arrived at Boston on Monday night with 67 cabin and 990 steerage passengers from Glasgow. Capt. McKillop reported an extraordinary quantity of icebergs in the steamship lane off the Newfoundland banks. For 200 miles, through Thursday night and Friday morning, he had to pick his way carefully through extensive flotillas of the ice masses. At one time he could see the icebergs lying menacingly on every side of his ship. They were of the dangerous type which sent the Titanic to the bottom, many of them 1,000 feet long, low-lying and shelving, extending wickedly out beneath the surface of the water, far beyond their visible limits. The bergs at times hemmed in the Numidian so closely that a stone might have been tossed from her decks on to some of them.
