

LIVELY DEBATE IN PARLIAMENT ON MILITARY VOTERS' ACT

Ottawa, Aug. 21.—Sir Robert Borden formally announced to the House of Commons today the resignation from the cabinet of Hon. Robert Rogers and the acceptance of his resignation.

He was not satisfied with his leadership. The matter, therefore, partook of a domestic quarrel, a difference of opinion between the prime minister and a member of his cabinet as to the manner in which the prime minister sought to carry on the business of the country.

In a few years," Mr. Borden said it was not true that he had expressed this sentiment. He was also quoted as saying that "the English are trying to provoke us in order to exterminate us. They will not be content with killing us; they will violate our wives and daughters; they will treat us as the Germans did the Belgians and the inhabitants of Northern France."

Mr. MacDonald maintained that the government appointees would have power to control the voting. There was no provision, he said, for a lock for the bag in which the votes would be deposited.

Mr. Pugsley thought that extraordinary powers were given to the deputy officers, which would enable a partisan to "steal the bag."

Col. Currie objected to the reading of the report, describing Mr. MacDonald's action as "fraudulent obstruction."

Mr. MacDonald having stated that the report was non-partisan, Colonel Taylor of New Westminster interposed to say that it had been prepared by three partisans appointed by the British Columbia legislature.
