STOCK MARKET UPSET BY LABOR CONFERENCE END

(Published by McDougall and Cowans.)
New York, Oct. 23.—President Wilson's second message to the industrial conference was a request that the group representing the public continue its work alone and draw up recommendations in respect to the handling of the labor problem. After announcing that the public group would make a report to the President, Chairman Lane finally adjourned the conference. Apparently this leaves the industrial labor situation about where it was before the conference met, that is a matter of great uncertainty. Nothing else came out during the day to suggest any agency which might work for industrial harmony in place of the conference which just collapsed. It was asserted in the House this afternoon that Congress would take up the labor question at the beginning of the regular session in December, but that of course would mean a delay that might prove embarrassing.
