

We are not going to say whether the rumours which are so prevalent are true or not; and we are certainly not bound to give them credence until they are anhat antiated in some way or another. bound to give them credence until they are substantiated in some way or another. It is not improbable that an investigation now going on before a Committee of the House of Commons may give us an insight into some of the peculiar operations which one hears so much of in the lobbies and corridors of Parliament, and even in the Chambers themselves. But we shall not anticipate. We refer to the rumours current simply to bring into prominence the very effectual way in which Dr. Tupper, in his powerful speech of Thursday night, nailed the Minister of Customs in one transaction at least. The member for Cumberland was reviewing with some sharpness the business character of Mr. Brydegs, more particularly in connection with the New Brunswick and Nova Scotia railways. Perhaps one need not be surprised at this, in view of the intense feeling of indignation which the Government management of these railways has excited in these Provinces. We say "the Government management" advisedly, because we prefer to hold the Ministry responsible for the acts of Mr. Brydges rather than to suppose he had exemption from that responsibility to the Administration of

What then was Dr. Tupper's point? A contract with the Spring Hill Mining Company was cancelled because it was thought that the honorable member for Cumberland was a leading stockholder in the Company. In this the Government made a mistake, because he was not a stockholder. But immediately afterwards a new contract was given to the same company, because, as the member for Cumberland said, a Cabinet Minister had an interest in it. This remark, which created some sensation in the House, brought to his feet Mr. Albert J. Smith, who desired to know to whom the speaker referred. "I make no charge, Mr. Speaker," replied Dr. Tupper, "which I cannot substantiate. I refer to the honorable the Minister of Customs, Mr. Burpee." Amid intensified sensation Mr. Burpee rose to say, in a confused sort of a manner, that he did not know whether he was a stockholder of the Compony or not; that he had had stock, but for nine months it had been in the hands of a broker, and he did not know but it had been sold before this. As may readily be supposed, the reply was somewhat of a damper to the Ministerial side of the House, and provoked applause from those who felt that Dr. Tupper had irrefragably established his case. It is of no consequence whether Mr. Burpee holds the stock now or not.
