## Honour Courses.

The following Courses are arranged for the advantage of Students who may be able to do more than the assignments of their classes ; and they will be open to the election of any Student after the middle of his first year, provided he has first-class standing in the prescribed Course. The value of the work performed in these studies will be determined by two examinations in each year, and Honour Certificates, of the first or second class, will be given, according to the results of these examinations. Students will not be allowed to continue in Honour studies, unless first-class standing is maintained in the prescribed Course. But any student who may wish to give special attention to any particular study, can have a certificate of the work done in the same.
