MINUTES OF THE PROCEEDINGS

OF THE

FOURTH LONDON CONFERENCE

THE METHODIST CHURCH,

HELD IN THE TOWN OF SARNIA, ONT.

THE Conference assembled in the Methodist Church, in the town of Sarnia, on Thursday, the second day of June, 1887, at 9 a.m.,—the Rev. W. R. PARKER, D.D., President, in the chair.

After singing the 753rd hymn, and reading portions of Scripture, the usual Conference prayer-meeting was held until 10 o'clock.

The District Secretaries presented the names of the laymen appointed delegates to this Conference.

The roll was called, and 105 ministers and 36 laymen answered to their names.

The President presented the Report of the Transfer Committee as follows:---

The Conference proceeded to the election of President, which resulted in the election, on the first ballot, of the Rev. W. S. PASCOE, D.D.

Rev. B. CLEMENT was, on ballot, elected Secretary.

Revs. J. G. Scott and Eli Middleton were appointed Assistant Secretaries, and Rev. W. W. Edwards, Journal Secretary.
