pressed this point upon his Prime Minister (Mr. Trudeau) and called upon the federal government to seek these broader powers?

Mr. Hopkins: He is not just my Prime Minister, Mr. Speaker; he is the Prime Minister of this country.

Some hon. Members: Hear, hear.

Mr. Gilbert: Don't brag about it.

Mr. Hopkins: Envy will get you nowhere. The hon member for Winnipeg North Centre has asked a very pertinent question. May I assure him that we in the Liberal party are liberal thinkers. We have the opportunity of expressing our views to our leader because he is a reasonable man.

May I conclude by saying that if my recommendations are not accepted, then I am not going to go away angry. I am going to come back and fight another day. That is the way democracy should work, and it is the way in which our democratic Prime Minister works.

Mr. Speaker: The hon. member for Broadview has 30 seconds.

Mr. John Gilbert (Broadview): Mr. Speakern it would take me 30 minutes to reply not only to the hon. member for Renfrew North (Mr. Hopkins) but also to the speech made by the minister in charge of housing. I should like to congratulate the hon. member for Hamilton West (Mr. Alexander) for the very fine speech he made which underlined the lack of leadership to deal with the problem of urban growth in Canada. I should also like to condemn the weak-kneed speech by the minister in charge of housing on this very important problem.
