Some of the inferior stuff however, seem very slowly at the old level of quotations. Colder weather is a great degree accountable for the better demand for meat. Quotations for butter, 66 to 68.50; med., \$5.25 to \$5.75; choice, 68 to 68.50; to \$5.50; com. to good, \$3.50 to \$5.80; choice cows, med. \$2.50 to \$5.50; stockers, \$3 to \$4.75 and canners, \$1.50 to \$2.

The high price of dairy products is being reflected in a keen demand for dairy cows. Choice milkers on this market range from \$46 to \$85, common to medium sort, \$40 to \$55 and singles, \$40 to \$80. Calves are \$7.75 to \$9.

Sheep are in great demand. Light ewes bringing \$4 to \$4.60; heavy, \$3 to \$3.50 and bucks and culls, \$1.50 to \$3.50; lambs are stronger at \$6 to \$6.75.

EXPORT BUTTER AND CHEESE Montreal, Saturday, Nov. 23.—There is a further advance in prices paid on country cows' offerings, prices ranging from 15c to 11.4c a pound. There are also a few more cows of the season will be held next week. Navigation is now practically closed.

There was a fair trade in dressed hogs, and fresh killed abattoir stock was quoted at \$12.25 to \$12.50.

GOSSIP

THE HOLSTEIN BLUE BOOK - A volume that should be of inestimable value to every breeder of Holstein-Friesian cattle is the twelfth of the yearly issues of the Blue Book which is just to hand. In the Blue Book will be found the names of every sire of the breed who has produced daughters with official records, and directly under the sire's name will be found a list of his daughters. This arrangement gives one an opportunity of easily determining the breeding and producing value of the various lines of the breed.

At the last annual meeting of the Holstein-Friesian Association of America, they unanimously resolved that the Canadian registrar department should compile and distribute this book to members at cost. This book can be secured on application to the Registrar, Houghton, Brattleboro, Vt. Its price is \$3.

ONTARIO CROP REPORT

The following is a summary of crop conditions in Ontario as gleaned from a report issued by the Ontario Department of Agriculture:

Fall Wheat: Yield below average and quality not up to standard. Wet weather caused sprouting in the stock. A smaller amount of grain will be needed for cropping next year. The new crop is reported as in good condition.

Barley: The yield has been good, but the quality is rather low to the mark. Discoloration due to wet weather is common. Oats: The oat situation may be summed up as generally fair, but the crop is lighter in weight and poorer in quality. Peas: A fair, good crop. Wet weather was injurious, but the weevil was not in evidence.

Knockabout: This crop was seeded on larger areas and has given good satisfaction in yield and quality. Wet weather delayed harvesting and there are some complaints of the grain shelling during the gathering.

Beans: Here again wet weather has led to imperfect growth and an inferior product. Corn: The rule there is much soft, immature corn, both for husking and in the silo. In some sections the crop is good, but generally it is not up to the average in either yield or quality.

Tobacco: The season was too wet and cold for the crop. The yield and quality will vary greatly from very poor to good.

Potatoes: A promising crop at digging time has been depreciated much by rot, the rot being estimated at five to 60 per cent.

Turnips: A good crop. Mangels: A good yield is reported in nearly every locality.

Hay: A good crop of Stock Summer and fall pastures are never better. All classes of live stock are reported to be in good condition for winter. Swine are common, and sheep and hogs cannot be found to meet the demand.

Dairying: The flow of milk has been largely curtailed, but is not in proportion to the appearance of the fields, and the grass was very soft. Dairymen will have a good supply.

It is several years since the outlook for fodder supplies has been so generally promising. Hay is plentiful and good, and there has not been any up to the standard in quality, there is enough of these and other roughage to feed the increased acreage devoted to alfalfa will lead to less feed being purchased. Hens: High prices for eggs and flesh have encouraged many farmers to give this branch more attention. The outlook for poultry culture is very favorable.
