The expenditure on Government railways before and since Confederation up to July 1, 1906, was on capital account \$154,876,086 and on income, \$159,466,261, making a total expenditure of \$314,842,847. The revenue received from July 1, 1867, to July 1, 1906, amounted to \$112,571,053. The expenditure on canals was \$114,395,28, and the revenue derived therefrom, \$13,514,-
