ANDERSON, GEORGE WILLIAM. (*Victoria*)

B., 20 May, 1836, at Upland Farm, Surrey, Eng. Ed. at Dorking. M., 22 Nov., 1859, at Dubuque, Iowa, Miss M. A. O'Connell. Is a farmer. First returned to Leg. Assem. at g. e. 1886 and re-elected at last g. e. A Conservative.—*Ferndale, Lake Dist., B. C.*

BAKER, *Lieut.-Col.*, JAMES. (*East Kootenay.*)

S. of the late Samuel Baker, Esq.; formerly of Lypiatt Park, Gloucester, Eng., and brother to Sir Samuel Baker, formerly Governor-General of Soudan and to General Valentine Baker Pacha. B. in London, Eng., 6 Jan., 1830. M. at Cork, Irel., 4 Dec., 1855, Sarah Louisa, dau. of Captain W. P. White. Is a Master of Arts, Cambridge Univ. Entered the Indian Navy in 1845; employed in the survey of Arabian coast and suppression of the slave trade. Passed examination as Lieutenant. Entered the army in 1852 as Cornet in the Royal Horse Guards, Blue; transferred to the 8th Hussars in 1854 and served in the Crimea. Present at the battle of the Tchernaya and siege and fall of Sebastopol. (Medals and clasp.) Selected to raise and command the Cam-
