Having failed to do so, the Company forfeited all the privileges conferred on them by this Act, which was, however, revived by 10 & 11 Vict. c. 86; and the period limited for the completion of the said works, extended to five years from the passing of the last cited Act—that is, to	
9 Vict24	An Act to allow the formation of more than one Agricultural Society in a County in Lower Canada, and for the relief of the Society for the County of Montreal.—This Act is not expressly made temporary, but the Agricultural Societies formed under it, are declared by Sect. 1, to be liable to the provisions of 8 Vict. c. 53, which is limited to 29th March, 1849, &c. but this period is further continued by 13 & 14 Vict. c. 10, to	lst Jan. 1851, &c.
9 Vict28	An Act to repeal certain Laws therein mentioned, to provide for a better defence of this Province, and to regulate the Militia thereof. Section 31 (Quakers, Mennonists and Tunkers' exemption) and so much of this Act, as repeals 4 & 5 Vict. c. 2, repealed by 12 Vict. c. 88, as far as regards Upper Canada. It is also amended by 12 Vict. c. 89, as regards the annual muster of the Militia in Upper Canada.—This Act is continued by 13 & 14 Vict. c. 11, to	10th Aug. 1853, &c.
	But the latter Act provides that if there shall be a War between Her Majesty and the United States of America, at the time at which the Militia Act would otherwise expire, it shall not expire till the end of the Session next ensuing the Proclamation of Peace.  An Act to continue and amend the Bankrupt Laws now in force in this Province.—This Act amends 7 Vict. c. 10, and both are continued by 13 & 14 Vict. c. 10 & 20, only as far as regards cases in which commissions had issued at the time of the passing of the last	
	mentioned Act, to	lst Jan. 1851, &c.
