Sir  
I have the honor to acknowledge  
receipt of yours of July 23<sup>rd</sup> 1880  
and in reply would say that Mr  
Switzer has settled with Mr William  
Thornburn of Muldum Bay paying for  
his improvements on the property  
the sum of One Hundred and thirty  
dollars

In regard to the portion of Land  
as described in my letter to you of  
the 5<sup>th</sup> July last Mr Switzer finds  
that it is insufficient for his  
mill purposes on account of the  
Bay running in a westerly direction  
instead of a southerly one as he supposed

Mr Switzer now applies for  
Land as follows (which is the portion he  
supposed he was asking for before and  
mentioned in mine of July 5<sup>th</sup>)
