	Saturday Aug.16th/41	"	Hon. F/L G.P.Gower, Protestant Padre taken on strength as Station Chaplain. The P.T. Officer arranged an excellent program of sports for all flights. A marked degree of keenness was displayed, and it was noted that most of the trainees are of splendid physique.	
	Sunday Aug.17th/41	"	Church Parade was not held, due to lack of accommodation.	
	Monday Aug.18th/41	"	Inauguration of systematic instruction of personnel posted to weekly fire piquet.

	Wednesday Aug.20th/41	"	<p>143 Aircrew being Entry # 34, reported to the Station. This personnel was posted to #2 Squadron. With the exception of a shortage in beds, all was in readiness for arrival of these pupils. With the exception of over-worked kitchen staff who served meals to 2100 hrs. no complicating factors arose, as beds arrived at 2200 hrs.</p> <p>Notwithstanding the hour of the arrival, the spirit of this Entry appeared to be excellent, and turned in with a will to make something of their new home.</p> <p>This Entry was largely comprised of Americans, and approximately 98% had found it necessary to work after school hours or during holidays, in order to receive a proper education. Their energy, initiative and keenness is an inspiration to the school.</p>	
	Thursday Aug.21st/41	"	<p>Commanding Officer's Parade and Inspection. A great improvement in dress and deportment was noted. A marked improvement had taken place in marching.</p> <p>Another large lecture room was completed. This addition rounds out the classroom accommodation. Course #34 was comfortably accommodated, permitting commencement of lectures immediately.</p>
