

would be impossible to plot the blocks on a plan. You should therefore furnish a plan by a Provincial Land Surveyor showing each portion surveyed and giving a description by metes and bounds of each block.

The conditional deeds are also returned for amendment and you will be good enough to state why the heirs of Julien Renaud de la Rivière lot 440 which apparently did not belong to him, or if it did you should file an assignment from Herbert Renaud, to Julien Renaud of the lot as before stated.

Evidence should also be furnished by affidavits of no reliable descent. It is stated that Julien Renaud
