


Ottawa, 9th November, 1915.

Sir:-

Referring to your letter of the 29th ultimo, I re-enclose herewith Mr. E. Boudreault's account therein referred to for supplies furnished to Indians preparatory to their going to hunt, and I beg to say that the Department is not prepared to pay accounts in excess of \$70.00 for supplies issued in each case. You were told in official letter of the 28th July that in no case was the advance made to an Indian to exceed this amount. It is gathered from your letter of the 27th September that you gave instructions to this effect to Mr. Boudreault and also that you reminded him of the same. It is assumed therefore that you advised him also with respect to the scale of prices to be allowed, as indicated in the letter quoted. When the accounts are again received, rendered upon the basis upon which the Department agreed to make payment, the question of the issue of a cheque in Mr. Boudreault's favour will be considered. Copy of the letter quoted is transmitted herewith.
