
Ottawa, March 2nd., 1920.

Sir,-

I am in receipt of your letter of the 23rd ultimo, making report relative to the trip which you and the Rev. Father Cadot and Chief Jones made to Walkerton to discuss with the Bruce County Council the question of repairing roads adjacent to the Cape Croker Reserve; and in reply I beg to say that your failure to set forth all the facts in the matter was the cause of misunderstanding. Had you intimated that the proposed expenditure of \$500.00 was to be defrayed by the Bruce County Council upon the understanding that the Indians would do the work under the supervision of you and Mr. Whicher, and that the County of Bruce bear all the expenses, the Department would have signified approval, and I may now state that if such work is undertaken it is hoped that you will see that it is done in a satisfactory manner.

You have the Department's authority to submit an account in detail covering the expenses of the trip taken to Walkerton as above referred to.
