Minutes, 20th March. Memorial of the secretary, Clark, referred to Council. Page 423

Report of Council, that the secretary is entitled to the recommendation asked for and for the loss sustained (see p. 427) in completing a certain number of other patents in which alterations were thought necessary. He should also be remunerated for the additional expense of supplying parchment instead of papers when patents are ordered to be so engrossed. 429

Minutes, 24th March. Reference of petition from Alexander McDonell, and recommending he should get the Salt Springs at Louth as requested. 431

Minutes, 28th April. Petition of Isaac, Jacob and Daniel Fraser, for a lease for twenty-one years of the Kingston mill stream, on conditions stated in the petition. 478

On petitioners giving security for the fulfilment of the conditions, &c., the lease recommended to be granted. 480

Schedule of full fee deeds laid before Council. 480

Order to Small, clerk of the Executive Council, that the clerks are to be paid by warrants on the Receiver General. 481

Grant of land on the Grand River surrendered by Jarvis. 482

Minutes, 1st May. Accounts audited. 484

Minutes, 4th May. Memorial of David Penfield for a patent for land on the Grand River bought from the heirs of the late Philip Stedman, and on which money has been paid in 1802. 487

On carrying out the terms with respect to the £8,841 Halifax currency, on payment of interest on the same from 5th February, 1805, as proposed by petitioner, and that the Indians in full council recommend the memorialist as a purchaser, recommends that the prayer of the petition be acceded to. 491

Minutes, 25th June. The Lieut. Governor has allowed the Inspector General of Accounts £140 Halifax currency salary for a clerk and same currency for rent of an office. 492
