Watch Public 5.—They will pay close attention to public Houses and See that they conform to the law, and note any cabs or vehicles acting in a suspicious manner.

Attend Fires. 6.—They will attend the fires that may occur in the city during their tour of duty, also any disturbance that may require their presence.

Report from Patrol Boxes. Patrol boxes and in the event of anything important occuring they will notify the officer on duty through the same means.

CONSTABLES.

Classification. Constables are divided into three classes, and the following periods of service are required from each before promotion from one to the other, but in every instance good conduct is necessary to advancement. Third class less than one year service; second class over one and under six years' service: first class over six
