for their students all the advantages to be derived from approved methods of exercise. On the ordinary days of class, three hours of recreation are given. The students have beautiful and extensive play grounds. Sundays and Thursdays are holidays. Classes, in general, are short and do not exceed one hour and a quarter at a time. The institution is furnished with bath room, private infirmary, etc.

Admission: The most favorable time for entrance is the first week of September, at the commencement of the scholastic year. Students entering their Latin Classes or wishing to compete for prizes—or attain any success in the other courses—must necessarily come at the opening of the first session. Newly admitted students must present a certificate of good character and, if they come from another institution, they must bring a letter of recommendation or of honorable dismissal.

**Discipline:** Letters, etc., sent by the students or delivered to them are liable to inspection.

The use of tobacco is forbidden.

No student will be retained who is known to indulge in vicious habits.

Summer vacation will begin about the 22nd day of June and will last until the first week of September. There is no Easter vacation. A few days are given at Christmas.

By the fact of the entry and enrollment of a pupil at the College, all the conditions of this Prospectus are accepted by the student and by his family.

Popils remaining at the College during the Christmas vacation will not be allowed to visit friends, unless they are authorized by their respective parents or guardians.

Parents and guardians will receive a semi-annual Bulletin of the health, application, progress, etc., of their children. A monthly Bulletin will be sent on demand.

Means of Emulation: The principal means of emulation are notes, competitions and examinations. Notes for
