

PROCLAMATION.

BY HIS EXCELLENCY

SIR JOHN WENTWORTH, Baronet, L. L. D.

Lieutenant. Governor and Commander in Chief in and over His Majesty's Province of Nova-Scotia, and its Dependencies, &c. &c.

HEREAS I have thought fit, by and with the confent of His Majesty's Council to dissolve the present General Assembly, which now stands prorogued to the Thirty first Day of October instant: I do for that end publish this Proclamation and do hereby dissolve the said General Assembly accordingly.

And the Members of His Majesty's Council, and the Representatives of the several Counties and Towns

within this Province, are discharged from any further Attendance.

And I do further declare, that with the Advice of His Majesty's Council, I have this day given orders to issue out Writs in due form for calling a new General Assembly; which Writs are to bear Test on Monday the Twenty first Day of October instant, to be returnable on Monday the Twenty third Day of December next.

SIR JOHN WENTWORTH, Baronet, L. L. D.

Lieutenant-Governor and Commander in Chief, in and over His Majesty's Province of Nova-Scotia, and its Dependencies, &c. &c. &c.

WHEREAS the Writs issued for calling the General-Assembly, and which bear Test the 21st of October last, are made returnable at Halifax, on Monday the 23d Day of this instant December; And it will be convenient, that the said General Assembly should meet for the Dispatch of Business on Thursday the Twentieth Day of February next.

I have therefore thought fit, by and with the Advice and Consent of His Majesty's Council, to direct, and I do hereby direct, the said General-Assembly, to meet at Halisan on the Twentieth Day of February next, for the Dispatch of Business, of which all and singular the Members chosen or to be chosen for the respective Counties and Towns within this Province, and all Sheriss or others whom it may concern, are required to take Notice and govern themselves accordingly.
