SHELL WORKS

Destroyed by Fire at Renfrew—Cause of Blaze Was Accidental.

Renfrew, March 15.—Fire broke out last night shortly after 9 o'clock in the shell factory operated for a year past by the Renfrew Machinery Co., and totally destroyed the building and its contents. So suddenly did the fire start, and so rapid was its spread, that the workmen were obliged to drop their tools and hurry out of the building. The workmen state that one of their number accidentally overturned a lead pot filled with molten lead, thus causing the fire. No one hints at incendiarism. Operations were carried on day and night, and employment was given to about one hundred mechanics. The fire brigade rendered excellent service, but with several streams could do no more than confine the fire to the building in which it started. No estimate of the loss has yet been made by the company, but it will be at least \$50,000, and there is about half that sum in insurance. The company will rebuild at once, having heavy orders on hand.
