FRED CLARK WANTS VALUE

Quality, not quantity is what a manager requires to build up a ball team. That, at least, is the theory on which Manager Mitchell of the Cubs, is operating. He is not anxious to corral all the ball players in the minor leagues to make a pennant winner, and is not eager to take all the mediocre men his scouts can find. What he insists on having is class.

Mitchell does not believe in wasting time and energy on players he knows never will make major league material. He does not think a manager ought to let his scouts pay out after sum for recruits who do not stand the slightest chance of being retained. The man he is after are those who possess the talent to stay with the big show.

An exorbitant sum was paid to the Baltimore club, of the International League, for outfielder Turner Barber. Mitchell did not let President Weegman write out the check until he saw the man himself and was satisfied in his own mind that Barber was a player of more than ordinary ability and was destined to develop into a star. He asked the club to hand out his enormous amount for the player because he will be worth more than that to the Cub machine.

Careful Selection.

"I would rather buy a few men like Barber than take a chance on a hundred players for whom the club would have to pay only \$1,000 or \$2,000," said Mitchell. "When you take a player with ability you are sure of getting results. But the others virtually all worthless to your club. I never believed in trying to build up a club with players of low ability. That system never will win.

"I watched Barber in four games in Baltimore and am convinced he will be a great player. I do not predict that he will be a wonderful star, but he will be one of the steady kind that will help the team. He is tall, rangy fellow, built something like Ty Cobb was when he first broke into the game. He has all the chance in the world to develop as he is only 24 years old.

"What I liked about him was the way he picked out the good balls to hit. He bats left-handed and in one of the games against a southpaw he drew three bases on balls. He got several of the right-handed twirlers. He is heading the league in batting and Barber is second. Barber is fast and likely to take an extra base on a hit any time.

"Barber will not report to us until the Baltimore club has its position in the race secure. I am going to play him in one of the outfield positions, but do not know which one. I will have to watch him a few days."

President Weegman is giving Manager Mitchell every assistance to build up a winner. Money is no object. If a player shows class and the Cubs can use him he is obtained, regardless of the cost. That has been shown to date by the amount of money that has been spent for young players. Barber is the highest priced player the club has had. He cost \$15,000. Charles Hollocher, the shortstop secured from Portland Ore., is said to have cost about \$10,000 with the players that have to be given in exchange; \$7,500 was paid for Roy Leslie, and \$5,000 for James Roy Leslie, a pitcher.

President Weegman is not thru buying. More players—and good ones—will be added to the staff, and it is expected when the club goes on its training trip to California Mitchell will have the most promising collection of young players a Cub manager ever has had to look after during the training period.

SYNOPSIS OF CANADIAN HOMEOWNERS' LAND REGULATION The sole head of a family, or any male over 18 years old, who was at the commencement of the present war, and has since continued to be a British subject or a subject of an allied or neutral country, may homestead a quarter-section of available Dominion Land in Manitoba, Saskatchewan or Alberta. Applicant must appear in person at Dominion Lands Agency or Sub-Agency for District. Entry by proxy may be made on certain conditions. He cannot secure a pre-emption, and cultivation of land in each of three years. In certain districts a homesteader may secure an adjoining quarter-section as pre-emption. Price \$200 per acre. Duties—reside six months in each of three years after earning homesteaded patent. Must reside six months in each of three years cultivate 60 acres and erect a house worth \$200.00. Holders of entries may count time of employment as farm labourer in Canada during 1917; as residence duties under certain conditions. When Dominion Lands are advertised or posted for entry, returned soldiers who have served overseas and have been honourably discharged, receive one day priority in applying for entry at local agency's office (but not Sub-Agency).
