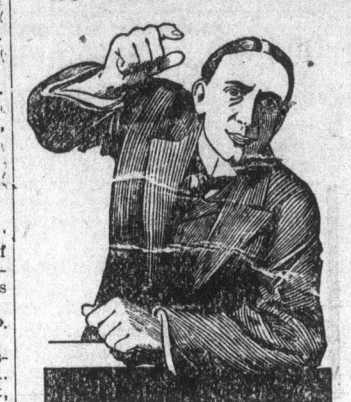

INTERNATIONAL BIBLE LESSON FOR TO-MORROW.

The Tongue and the Temper.—Matt. 5:33-45. Read Matt. 5:17-32.
Golden Text—"Keep the door of my lips."—Ps. 141:3.

Are the teachings of this sermon on the mount practicable? Yes, but only to those whose hearts are filled with God's love. People are agreed that degenerates and outcasts need to be born again, and so they do, but this sermon proves that all men not only need regeneration, but the indwelling of God's spirit in sanctifying power, to obey their King.

The life lived by the Jew, in obedience to the Mosaic law as he understood it, was a much lower moral life than a Christian life lived in obedience to the Holy Spirit now. Read Rom. 8:1-5. The law of the Spirit of Life in Christ Jesus imparts life and power to the trusting soul, and then new found heartfelt energy inspires obedience to the will of God, and the will of God, in its indwelling, executive power, is our only sanctification.

Verse 33—Mark, thou shalt not swear by thyself, and verses 34 to 37, but I say unto you, swear not at all, but let your yea be yea, and your nay be no, in truthful simplicity; anything added as emphasis is of the evil one. R. A.—An oath implies the that without its use you are at liberty and liable to be untruthful.

Verses 38-42—An eye for an eye and a tooth for a tooth, all right in Moses' time, but far below the requirement of my followers, inspired by the Holy Spirit—Luke 11, 13—which your Heavenly Father gives to those who ask Him. Herein is meekness, to be smitten and submit willingly to its reproaches when the verdict is against you to restore over and above what the law requires. See Zechariah. If government officers compel you to drive them a mile drive them two miles. If the poor come to borrow, make a gift. Verses 43 to 48—Love your friend, hate your enemy? No! The law of my kingdom is love your enemy also. John 3:16—"For God so loved the world, that he gave his only-begotten Son, that whosoever believeth in him should not perish, but have everlasting life." Salute each other in their synagogues and societies, with a friendly grasp, but your children of God will be like Him, and love everybody. We are created and redeemed to glorify God and enjoy Him forever.
