THE VICTORIA ELECTION.  
The result of the election in Victoria is disappointing, and it is to be regretted in the interest of the county itself, which has for the present lost the services of a very capable and highly respected representative.

The election is now over, and by no means too scrupulous body of opponents of the government, whose only inspiration is a thirst for office, has succeeded for the present in deluding the people in Victoria county.

The opposition press pretend to regard the election of Porter as evidence of a great change of public sentiment hostile to the government since January last.

The election in Victoria outside of the parish of Lorne, which last month gave Porter a majority of twenty and in January gave Baird a majority of nineteen, was very nearly, if not entirely, a personal contest.

All the opposition harangues on the subject of stamps, white wash bill and kindred large questions of government policy, only had the effect of adding to Baird's vote so that the only thing remained to be done was to change the names on the ballot.

Mr. Gregory went to Victoria also. It is true he holds no recognized public position and can get no constituency; but he does hold a brief to abuse and slander the attorney general, and all at hazards pull him and his government down.

The defeat of Mr. Baird in the Tobique river parish naturally raises a doubt as to the desire of the people of those parishes for the construction of the Tobique Valley railway. It is to say the least, a poor return for the untiring efforts of his member had put forward to secure this subsidy, and an inference might fairly be drawn that the people were more anxious to punish Mr. Baird for some trifling shortcoming on his part, as their representative; or the government for the fancied wrong it had done them in respect of the fisheries that they were to be the iron horse steaming up the fertile valley at an early day.

much the people of the Tobique river themselves deserve to be taken at their word, we are well assured no such consideration will influence the action of the government; and that having decided to ask the legislature to promote this railway upon its merits and with the conviction that the interest of the whole province justify the undertaking, there will be no retracting of its steps.

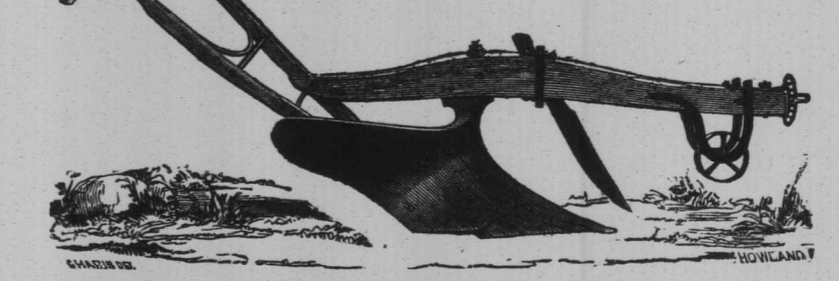
