Colonial Secretary Department of the Colonial Secretary, July 20th, 1915.

(1) After the date hereof an alien oming from any place outside of the Island of Newfoundland and its Deendencies as a passenger shall not. without the permission of the Colonial ecretary, land or embark at any ort in the Island of Newfoundland r its Dependencies, unless he has in is possession a passport issued to nim not more than two years previously by or on behalf of the Governnent of the country of which he is subject or citizen, or some other document satisfactorily establishing his nationality and identity, to which passdocument there must be at-

sion of the Colonial Secretary has been granted subject to any conditions, and the person to whom it is granted fails e shall be deemed to be guilty of a ontravention of these Rules and Re-

(3) For the purposes of these Rules nd Regulations the expression "passenger" includes any person carried on a ship other than the master and persons employed in the service of the

(4) Any person found guilty of a breach of these Rules and Regulations shall be liable, upon summary conviction before a Stipendiary Magistrate, to a penalty not exceeding one thousand dollars or imprisonment for any term not exceeding one year, or to both fine and imprisonment. jly22,2i
