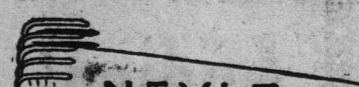

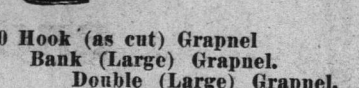

Under the provisions of the War
Measures Act, 1914, the following
Rules and Regulations respecting
Passports have been approved by His
Excellency the Governor in Council.

JOHN R. BENNETT,
Colonial Secretary,
Department of the Colonial Secretary,
July 20th, 1915.

(1) After the date hereof an alien
coming from any place outside of the
Island of Newfoundland and its De-
pendencies as a passenger shall not,
without the permission of the Colonial
Secretary, land or embark at any
port in the Island of Newfoundland
or its Dependencies, unless he has in
his possession a passport issued to
him not more than two years previ-
ously by or on behalf of the Govern-
ment of the country of which he is a
subject or citizen, or some other docu-
ment satisfactorily establishing his
nationality and identity, to which pas-
port or document there must be at-
tached a photograph of the alien to
whom it relates.

(2) Where any such special permis-
sion of the Colonial Secretary has been
granted subject to any conditions, and
the person to whom it is granted fails
to comply with any such conditions,
he shall be deemed to be guilty of a
contravention of these Rules and Regu-
lations.

(3) For the purposes of these Rules
and Regulations the expression "pas-
senger" includes any person carried
on a ship other than the master and
persons employed in the service of the
ship.

(4) Any person found guilty of a
breach of these Rules and Regulations
shall be liable, upon summary con-
viction before a Stipendiary Magis-
trate, to a penalty not exceeding one
thousand dollars or imprisonment for
any term not exceeding one year, or
to both, fine and imprisonment.
