Guelph Markets.

As predicted in our last review, there has been a downfall in prices since the advent of snow and good sleighing. Fall wheat, which, a week since, sold for from \$1.04 to \$1.15, now brings only from 95 cents to \$0.98; Spring wheat has also declined from \$1.00 to \$9 cents; and there is a corresponding decrease in nearly all kinds of coarse grain. Hay, however, Las gone up in price, as will be seen by comparison of to-day's quotations and last Wealnesday's; but this forms an exception to the general rule. On Tuesday about 12,900 bushels of wheat came to the Guelph market, and sold at rates quoted. The downward tendency of prices has been by no means arrested, and holders exhibit a disposition to submit to the decline. Oats and barley regnain firm, and peas nominal. Provisions remain almost unchanged since our last report. Butter is somewhat easier, selling now at 18 to 12 cents for store-pack, and 19 to 29 for dairy. Eggs are coming in more freely and sell affront last to 20c.
