Baron Anselm de Rothschild, who died recently at his country seat, near Vionne possessed wealth estimated at more than \$200,000,000. By his express desire his funcral was celebrated without any pomp The hearse was drawn by two horses, and followed only by a few servants.

A French court has decided that a man may not trade under his own name when that name is manifestly used to induce the public to think it is that of an old established firm. Moet, a Dutchman, was selling champagne, using the brand "Moet & Clo.," which the well known frm "Moet & Chandop," proved had led the people to believe was their wine. The Court ordered Moet to discontinue using the title on his wines, and fined him \$7,000 damages.
