Mr. Hunt, of the Royal Company, was allowed to speak and said no change should be made in the tenders.

A representative of the Edison Company said their figures were guaranteed. They would supply triple-carbon lights which would burn sixteen hours. Double-carbon lamps were patented and the Edison Company had to give up their use.

Mr. Flock, on behalf of the Ball Company, addressed the Council. He referred to some remarks of the Edison representative.

Mayor Taylor suggested that only argu-ment in favor of the various companies should be indulged in—not criticism of each

should be indulged in—not criticism of each other.

Mr. Flock appealed to the Council from such interruptions by the Mayor.

Ald. Jones took the Mayor's part, so the Ball representative continued. He ridiculed the insinuation that double carbon lights could not be used and claimed that no patent on the article existed in Canada. He read a telegram from the city electrician of Halifax to Ald.
