One mile, professional, championship (final heat)—F. W. Young, F. Loughhead, J. Gratz, W. E. Young, A. McLeod, C. Elliott, and W. M. Macintosh started. Loughhead led for first quarter, followed by McLeod and Gratz. Macintosh then took the lead, having McLeod and Loughhead right on his heels. Although Loughhead led for a time, McLeod gradually closed the gap, and both came in together. This was declared a dead heat between McLeod and Loughhead. Macintosh 3, Time, 2:33 4-5.
