


Numerous rules in the baseball code were threshed out at the annual meet-ing of the rules committee. Chief among these were rules relating to the home run, the intentional pass, the balk, the "dead ball," and regarding freak deliveries of pitchers. It was finally agreed that the spit-ball be abolished after the 1920 season. In all nineteen rules were amended, and one added.

ntentional pass, declaring it illegal for the catcher to step from his box to aid the pitcher in pitching wide to the batsman. This rule as amended and adopted by the rules committee said:

"It shall be illegal for the catcher t to leave his natural position immediately and directly back of the plate for the purpose of aiding the pitcuer in intentionally giving a base on balls to the batsman. If the catcher shall move out of position prior to the time the ball leaves the pitcher's hand ali runners who may be no bases shall be the ball leaves the pitcher's hand all runners who may be on bases shall be entitled to advance one base."

The rule governing the home run says that when a player knocks the ball into the stands or the crowds on fair ground he shall be given credit for a home run if he completes the circuit and all runners shall score ahead of him.
