Associated Press Despatch. New York, July 12.-With a view to solving problems raised by the threatened embargo on pulpwood exports from Canada to the United States, a number of leading paper

Tomato Gelatin Salad.

Cook half a can of tomatoes with half a cup of celery, half a bay leaf and a small onion cut fine, for five minutes. Strain through a coarse sieve, add two tablespoonfuls vine-gar and enough water to make a pint. Heat to boiling point and pour it over a package of gelatin. Add a dash of red pepper and salt to taste. Pour in individual molds and when firm serve on lettuce leaves with salad dressing, or jell in border mold, turn on a plat-or jelly.

Dissolve one package of gelatin in one-half pint of boiling water. Stir until dissolved. Then add two table-spoonfuls of vinear to enough water to make one-half pint and pour all together. Then add one tablespoonful Spanish pepper. When the gelatin starts to set add three or four slices of finely-chopped cold boiled ham, one-half cup chopped raw cabbage, one-fourth cup pimento shredded, three sweet pickles chopped fine and one-half cup broken walnut meats. Serve on lettuce leaves with mayon-naise dressing.

Beat the white of one egg stiff, add syrup in thin stream, beating all the time. Slowly beat in gelatin and continue beating until the mixture will stand up in points. Then have some fresh fruit according to season. Oranges are good most of the year, and are very valuable. Avoid fresh hot breads, eat your cereals in the form of ready-to-eat foods, rather than the home-cooked porridge. For lunch have a salad of fresh vegetables served with plenty of oil, more orisp bread, and a dessert of fresh or stewed fruit or a frozen pudding. At dinner add a bulky vegetable to the menu and eat meat or fish very plainly cooked, without fancy sauces. Avoid all "made" dishes. Drink plenty of water, at least four plasses daily beside what you take at meals. Don't forget exercise. The "daily dozen" are of immense help in combating constipation.
