MAKING BUTTONS.

Potato Combined With Acids Makes Hard Substances.

Few persons know that buttons are made from such queer things as roots, potatoes, hoots, horns, blood, persimmon, skin mill, shell, glass and seaweed, as well as various kinds of metals.

Buttons are children of civilization. Savages use string to fasten their clothes together. The Greeks and Romans got along with merely a sash, the flowing, sheet-like masses of their garments not requiring anything more certain in the nature of fastenings.

Buttons were first used on clothing for ornamental purposes. They were soon followed by loops and buttons. The evolution of the button-hole came last of all. Buttons were first used in southern Europe in the thirteenth or fourteenth century.

Vegetable ivory is one of the most popular materials for the making of buttons. It is made from the fruit of a South American palm called the corozo nut, and really resembles pure ivory. They are easy to manufacture on account of their susceptibility to dye and the ease with which they can be turned in a lathe. These nuts are shaded in a rotary iron drum, arranged in three rows, sharp, sharp, sharp in the interior. The nuts are then cut in halves, out of which the buttons are made.

The dyeing is done by expert chemists who guard their processes carefully so that competitors may not learn their methods. The buttons are dried in wire trays and are subjected to considerable heat. They are polished by means of felt-lined barrels, by polishing stones and by hand.

The taking of a bath in the Mississippi river in Illinois by J. F. Roop in July, 1887, was the beginning of the pearl button industry in the United States. Roopie and his friend while plunging around in the river and, being of curious temperament, he sought to ascertain the cause and, to his amazement, found the bottom of the river covered with mussel shells. They were exactly what he had been looking for since coming to America.

The demand for shells for button making has brought into existence the mussel fishery industry. The men engaged in mussel fishing gather from 40,000 to 60,000 tons of shells annually, worth from \$400,000 to \$1,000,000. In addition to this they find from \$300,000 to \$400,000 worth of pearls every year.

The approximately 500 species of fresh-water mussels in America. The commercial species are practically restricted to seven waters derived from the drainage of limestone regions. Here the mollusk finds an abundance of food, and with the depth of water, currents and other conditions favorable to its reproduction and growth. Many species of mussels occur in the streams of the Atlantic coast, but their shells are either shabby and eroded or else too small and too thin for commercial use. Fresh water mussels of commercial value are not so yet known from streams on the Pacific slope.

Each year Americans use \$25,000,000 worth of buttons, but in the fresh water pearl, ocean pearl, metal, vegetable, ivory, cloth, bone, composite and other materials.

The bulk of these being made from mussel shells.

Arabic Dictionary Is Heavy.

Arabic dictionaries of 500 pages ago, which are still the great authority for students in that language, more than surpass the ponderous dictionaries of Europe, even the famous many-volume etymological index of Larousse, the monumental work of all modern tongues.

The Arabic dictionary most used by scholars familiar with no other language, which was made in the time of the great Caliph Haroun al Rashid, is 10 3/4 quarte volumes and weighs close to 100 pounds. There is a 60-page, 16-volume abridgement of it, presumably for use at home.

Arabic dictionaries are of so large a size because each of the words that have been familiar in the daily life of the nomad Arabs for centuries has an enormous number of synonyms.

The camel, for example, has no other name in 133 different ways. In all, the horse and the sword were the two great standbys of the Arab, and more than 500 different words convey ideas of the two Arab essentials. All other familiar words are interchangeable and in constant use.

Making Pearls to Order.

Some years ago considerable interest was taken in the discovery of a method of making real diamonds. There was no mistake about the genuineness of the gems produced. The drawback lay in the fact that they were exceedingly small.

Fourteen years ago a French scientist confirmed, by careful investigation, the accuracy of this idea. One a pearl is the result of a disease which attacks the pearl oyster, says answers.

Having established this fact, his next step was to procure a number of pearl oysters and plant them in his own pearl fishery in French waters, after first inoculating them with the disease which induces them to produce pearls.

At first the pearls he had been able to produce by this means were small and of little worth; but, as he himself remarked, they were real pearls, not mere globules of mother-of-pearl.
